SUPPLEMENTARY SAFETY, SPECTATOR SAFETY and OPERATIONS MANUAL

Saturday 21st & Sunday 22nd October 2017

This document gives specific information relating to this round of the BCCC and it should be read in conjunction with the Generic Safety Plan.

Copies of the Generic Safety Plan are available from Rally HQ.

The person in overall charge of the event and responsible for health and safety issues shall be the Clerk of the Course, to whom support staff have been allocated to monitor all health and safety regulations and aspects of the event.

He may delegate such responsibility as he thinks fit and as circumstances so demand.

He has appointed a Spectator & Event Safety Officer.

Spectators are not expected to attend in large numbers but provision has been made for such spectators as may attend to park in a safe area away from the stage and spectate in safe areas, particularly in the vicinity of the start and finish and service area.

Spectators are not permitted between the stage and any Safety markers which may be erected. Any walkers, cyclist, horse riders or those with rights of access who approach the area will be informed of the event by the marshals at those locations where such rights of way exist. If they wish to continue, appropriate action will be taken to ensure their safety.

Remember.

All vehicles should be positioned at least 30 metres away from the course of the Stage.

All escape roads must be kept clear for emergency use.

No vehicle will move on the Special Stage without the approval of the Clerk of Course or Radio Controller.

In the event of an incident, priority must be given to those persons injured. Vehicles should only be moved if they are blocking the stage.

Land R.V. points are marked on the enclosed Map. Free access should be maintained at all times for Emergency Vehicles.

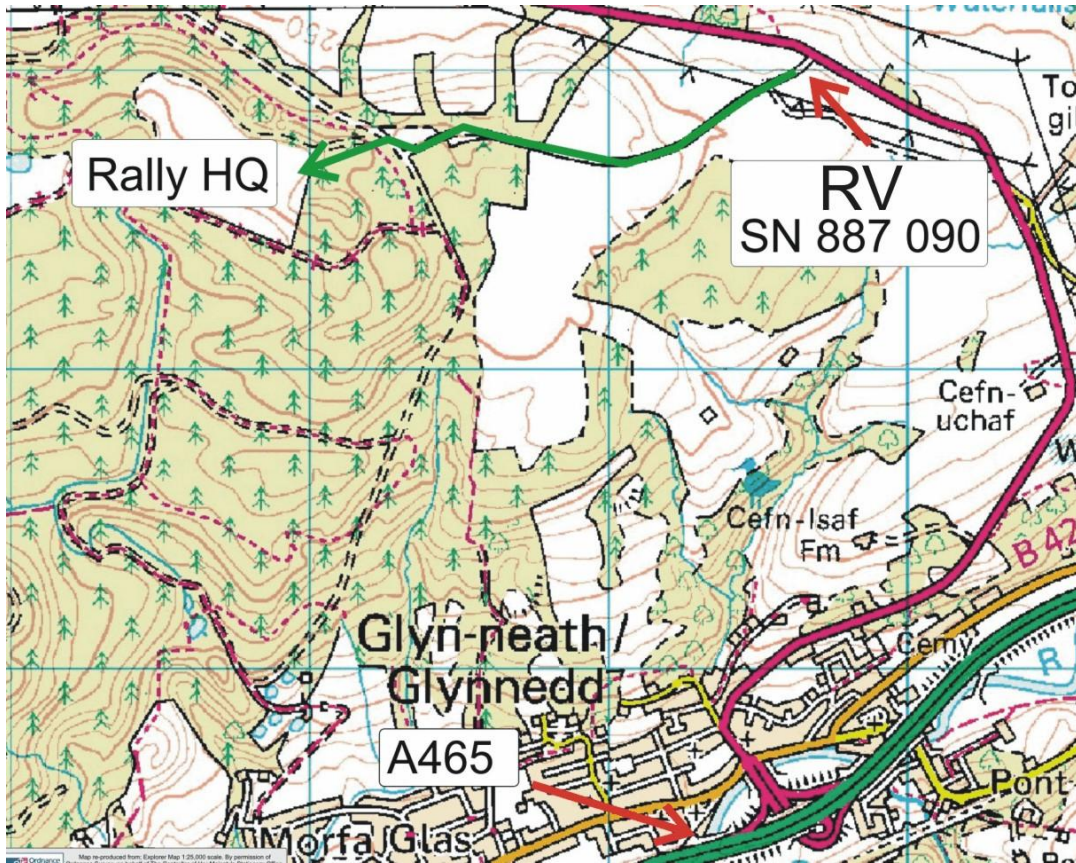
All personnel must sign on with the Chief Marshal at Rally HQ.

If the Doctor or Paramedic attending the incident considers an ambulance is required, he shall notify the Radio Controller accordingly; if he considers that the Air Ambulance is required, due to major trauma, spinal injuries and inaccessibility for a normal ambulance, this should be notified to the Radio Controller, with an Ordnance Survey Map sheet number and an accurate map reference of the position of the incident. The Radio Controller will then notify Ambulance Control during the 999 call of the requirement either for the Land Ambulance and give the RV Point, or for the Air Ambulance and give the map reference.
